Annual Meeting

ust as spring comes every year so does the 3 Rivers Telephone Cooperative annual meeting. This year during the 56th Annual Meeting our General Manager Steve Krogue highlighted the accomplishments of the co-op over the past year and outlined our plans for the coming year.

Steve started out with the mission of the Cooperative, "3 Rivers' mission is to furnish state-of-the-art communications service to its members at the lowest congratulations and well wishes for Keith and his wife Sharon while presenting

possible cost, while insuring adequate revenue to maintain and operate its properties and reduce debt." Basically we're upgrading our equipment to the latest technologies to bring our members the services they want today and make sure we're ready for the changes that are coming in the future. We are replacing our older facilities with new fiber lines and equipment. Theses changes are happening in some of our exchanges that have the oldest equipment, Carter, East Conrad, Fort Shaw, Heart Butte, Dupuyer, Harrison and Pony. We have also made upgrades in Augusta, Browning, Fairfield, Stockett, Big Sky and Ennis.



Steve also touched upon the economic situation that our cooperative and our country are facing. "The Cooperative reported slimmer margins in 2008 due to adjustments made to our cost study calculations as well as a write down to some investments." He also noted that due to a national trend of people dropping their landline in favor of cell phones we are noticing a loss in basic service and long distance revenues.




